 - II. All the orders in respect of central Law Enforcement Agencies are being issued by competent authority, who is the Union Home Secretary at the Centre.
 - III. & IV: Further detail/breakup of numbers other than the average number under interception as indicated in para I, cannot be provided as the information sought comes under sub-section 1(a) and 1(g) of Section 8 of the RTI Act, 2005. Moreover, this information is not being compiled.
 - 3.
